# NEW OYSTER REEF CONSTRUCTED IN ALAQUA BAYOU

The Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance and Eglin Air Force Base have partnered to construct a brand new oyster reef in Alaqua Bayou. Nearly 500 of the 1700 foot reef has been constructed, much of which was created using recycled shells from local restaurants. "So far we have been able to cover a lot of ground in a short amount of time," Rachel Gwin, CBA Restoration Coordinator explains, "After our first monitoring session, we are already seeing crabs and shrimp utilizing newly created habitat." When complete, the reef will reduce erosion along the banks of the bayou.


