- ▶ Sixty percent of the juniors in Florida Universities attended Community or State Colleges

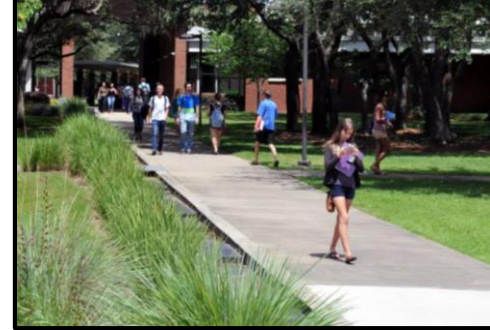


Dual Enrollment Statement of Purpose

The mission of dual enrollment, as specified by the State Legislature, is three-fold:

- ▶ To shorten the time necessary for a student to complete the requirements of a postsecondary degree and high school diploma.
- ▶ To broaden the scope of curricular options available to students.
- ▶ To increase the depth of study available for a particular subject.

Eligibility



- ▶ **3.0 Un-Weighted cumulative GPA in high school**
- ▶ **Passing scores on a state-approved placement test (PERT, SAT, ACT). Score requirements exist for placement in some courses.**

The dual student must place into College level classes in all three categories before registering for more than 12 cumulative college credits, OR maintain concurrent enrollment in a parallel high school course.

No dual enrollment student shall be enrolled in a college mathematics, English, Gordon Rule social science or humanities course unless the student has demonstrated adequate pre-collegiate preparation on the basic mathematics and communication skills assessment of an approved entry level placement test. Enrollment Procedure

- ▶ **Consult with a high school guidance counselor**
- ▶ **The counselor (or principal's designee) must fill out the NWFSC dual enrollment form and include the student's high school GPA, test scores, and course selection(s)**
- ▶ **The NWFSC dual enrollment form requires parental permission.**
- ▶ **Form can be turned in to any NWFSC campus.**



Credit

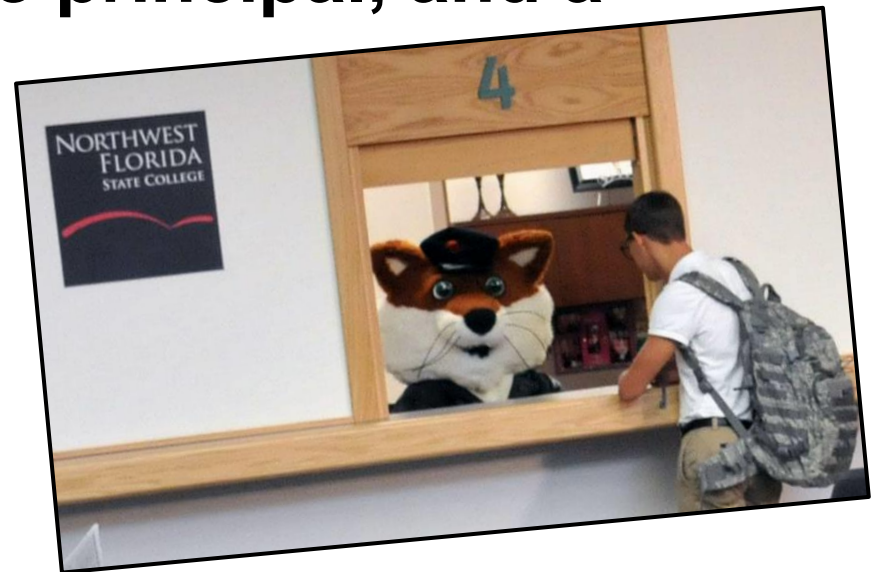
- ▶ **Completion of a dual enrollment course will result in .5 or 1 high school units, sometimes referred to as Carnegie units, according to DOE rules.**

Schedule Adjustment Period

- ▶ During the NWFSC Drop/Add period, students may change their schedule.
- ▶ The procedure is the same as a new registration and requires written notice on a college form executed by the student, a parent, a designee of the principal, and a college official.



Withdrawal Procedures

- ▶ **Requires an official college withdrawal form with required signatures.**
- ▶ **The withdrawal will appear on the college transcript**
- ▶ **A withdrawal does not negatively impact a student's NWFSC GPA but may have impact on University admissions into specialized fields**
- ▶ **Dual students must withdraw from a course before taking the final exam**
- ▶ **A dual student may not repeat a course from which they have completed or withdrawn (successfully or not) as a dual student**

- ▶ **NWFSC Dual Enrollment works with students parents, and schools to optimize the Dual Enrollment experience for all students**
- ▶ **The goal of dual enrollment is the opportunity for students to accelerate and enhance their learning.**
