Course Curriculum

THIS COURSE INTRODUCES STUDENTS TO RHETORICAL CONCEPTS AND AUDIENCE-CENTERED APPROACHES TO WRITING INCLUDING COMPOSING PROCESSES, LANGUAGE CONVENTIONS AND STYLE, AND CRITICAL ANALYSIS AND ENGAGEMENT WITH WRITTEN TEXTS AND OTHER FORMS OF COMMUNICATION.

Goals

Students will achieve competency in writing for multiple audiences and purposes, researching and using sources correctly in MLA format, and implementing various rhetorical strategies by considering/employing the main rhetorical techniques.
